Native American Performers & Storytellers

What: Crazy Horse Memorial strives to provide our guests and community with high quality and exciting Native American performers/storytellers from across North America. Performances are to serve as a creative bridge and be a positive opportunity to share Native American culture with diverse groups of visitors from all different places, cultures, and walks of life. Please describe the type and content of your performance. _____

Who: Any enrolled tribal member of the Indigenous peoples of North America including Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, First Nations of Canada, and Indigenous cultures of Mexico. Performance groups and families are encouraged to apply, but groups will need to designate a head performer or main contact. Head performer must be at least 18 years or older as of the first day of the performances. Proof of enrollment of head performer must be included with application where applicable. Applicants must provide an audition video or link to video of a prior performance. Applicants will be selected by Museum staff, based on the quality of the audition video, and on their references.

Where: Performances will be on the **outdoor Veranda covered stage**. In case of inclement weather, performances may be relocated to another area at Crazy Horse Memorial if necessary to accommodate the safety of the audience. Some special performances will be in THE INDIAN MUSEUM OF NORTH AMERICA® or THE NATIVE AMERICAN EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL CENTER®.

Meals & Housing: Performers will receive one buffet meal, at the Laughing Water Restaurant, on the days of performance only. Additional performers joining contracted performer are allowed one buffet meal at Laughing Water Restaurant if they are participating in the performance or are serving in a managerial capacity. All guests of performers not acting in a support or management role are not provided meals. Accommodations may be provided at a designated hotel for special performers traveling from outside the Black Hills region.

Transportation: Performers are responsible for their own transportation to and from Crazy Horse Memorial for performances.

Compensation: Performers receive \$150 per performance, as specified on the Performance Schedule Agreement, and based on the number of performances, not the number of people in the group. Special Events Performers rates vary based on the length and type of performance or event, as negotiated in the signed Performance Schedule Agreement.

Guidelines:

- Performers are invited to share their cultural background by interacting with the public, and demonstrating their artistic process.
- Performers are expected to arrive at least 30 minutes before performance times.
- Content of performances should be positive, educational, entertaining, and appropriate for family audiences.
- Performers should exemplify a strong work ethic, a professional demeanor, and positive and appropriate communications.
- Performers are allowed to sell merchandise including but not limited to books, CDs, artwork, etc., **but must obtain advanced approval from the Cultural Programs Manager**. A current South Dakota Sales Tax License is also required.
- Soliciting of tips before, during, or after performances is strictly prohibited at Crazy Horse Memorial.

Cancellation: Accepted performers must notify the Cultural Programs Manager, **on or before Feb 12, 2021**, if they are unable to participate for any reason. Notification after the deadline or failure to appear at the Crazy Horse Memorial as scheduled, could disqualify applicants from applying for cultural programs for 2 years.
