Crazy Horse Memorial®: August Daily Performances and Special Events

During the month of August, The Indian Museum of North America® at Crazy Horse Memorial® will continue to feature a variety of regional Native American performers on the outdoor stage, for daily performances. These will include Rosebud Lakota hoop dancer, Starr Chief Eagle, Standing Rock Sioux dancers and storytellers, the Rencountre Family Performers, and for their first time at Crazy Horse Memorial, Yankton Sioux performers, the Lyle Miller Family. Performances are presented for visitors daily at 11:30 AM, 1:30 PM, and 4:30 PM.

On August 1st at 6:30 PM we will be hosting a special performance by Native American rock group, Brulé. Brulé will be bringing their electrifying show to our indoor Welcome Center Theater stage, which combines rock music with traditional Native American instrumentation and dance.

Seating and viewing areas will be modified to adhere to current social distancing recommendations during this time, while extra precautions will be taken to keep both performers and the public safe.
