What: Native and non-Native artists, performers, and culture bearers have the opportunity to share their knowledge and skill with visitors to Crazy Horse Memorial by offering a 60 minute presentation on a Thursday evening during June, July, or August. The program provides an opportunity for visitors to learn and interact with the presenter about current cultural issues, histories, films, artistic projects, and other matters related to North American Indians.

Who: Native artists, musicians, actors, historians, culture bearers, writers, educators, who are enrolled members of a federally or state recognized tribe, or non-Native cultural experts, historians, writers, etc., working with Native community issues. Applicants will be selected based on experience, topic, fit with the mission of the Crazy Horse Memorial Foundation, and perceived interest for our audience. It is Crazy Horse Memorial's goal to provide an opportunity for selected professionals to share their knowledge and skill with an international audience providing a greater understanding of Native culture.

When: Thursday evenings at 6:30 pm in various locations at Crazy Horse Memorial. (*Participants are required to arrive at Crazy Horse Memorial no less than 30 minutes prior to their scheduled presentation or performance*).
