Mountain Carving Crew Member

Crazy Horse Memorial Foundation is a 501c3 Public Charity of International scope that is a cultural, educational and humanitarian project of 74 years dedicated to protecting and preserving the culture, traditions, and living heritage of the Indigenous people of North America. The Foundation demonstrates its commitment to this endeavor by continuing progress on the world's largest sculptural undertaking by carving a Memorial of Lakota leader Crazy Horse; by providing educational and cultural programming; by acting as a repository for American Indian artifacts, arts, and crafts through THE INDIAN MUSEUM OF NORTH AMERICA® and the NATIVE AMERICAN EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL CENTER®; and by establishing and operating THE INDIAN UNIVERSITY OF NORTH AMERICA®, and when practical, a medical training center for American Indians.

As a mountain carving crew member you would be part of the largest mountain carving in the world. The position holds the possibility of challenges, a variety of work, and a feeling of satisfaction. You will have the chance to learn new skills and contribute to something lasting for centuries.

The job is physically and mentally demanding and crew members must be prepared to work in an outdoor environment exposed to the elements. This position requires the operation of various rock drills, diamond coated cable saws, radial arm rock saws, a variety of hand tools, and various pieces of construction equipment. This includes operating various types of lifts, cranes, and telehandlers used to move and setup work platforms and equipment. Crew members must be comfortable with yet have a healthy respect for heights. A willingness and ability to follow safety regulations is required.

The ideal candidate will have good communication and math skills, three or more years of outdoor, hands-on experience with various combinations of concrete demolition and removal; dimensional stone cutting operations; crane setup and operation; mechanized scaffolding setup and operation; and rope access training and experience. While familiar equipment are used, the unique nature of the project means they may be customize to our particular needs and safety requirements. Thus, machining and fabrication skills are also a valuable asset.

Our processes adapt and change with time. Few, if any applicants come in with all the necessary skills. The ability and willingness to learn and adapt are crucial. The Crew's day-to-day safety depends upon excellent communication abilities, dependability, and trust in a tight-knit workgroup.

This is a Full-time year round, non-exempt, hourly position with competitive compensation.

Benefits includes medical, dental and vision, paid time off, paid holidays, a retirement plan, an annual trip to the top of the mountain carving for family and friends, and the opportunity to be a part of history.
